Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014

109 Functions and powers

- (1) The Maunga Authority has the powers and functions conferred on it by or under this Act or any other enactment.
- (2) In exercising its powers and carrying out its functions in relation to the maunga, the Maunga Authority must have regard to—
 - (a) the spiritual, ancestral, cultural, customary, and historical significance of the maunga to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau; and
 - (b) section 41(2).
- (3) In exercising its powers and carrying out its functions in relation to the administered lands, the Maunga Authority must have regard to the spiritual, ancestral, cultural, customary, and historical significance of the administered lands to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau.

[Emphasis added]

41 Maunga must remain as reserves vested in trustee

- (1) This section applies to each maunga once the maunga is—
 - (a) vested in the trustee under subpart 1, 2, or 3 of this Part;and
 - (b) Declared a reserve under any of sections 18 to 29, 33, and 39.
- (2) The maunga is held by the trustee for the common benefit of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau and the other people of Auckland.

Appointment of members to Tūpuna Maunga Authority Rōpū

Purpose

1. This report outlines the requirement to make replacement appointments for the Tūpuna Maunga Authority Filming and Events Rōpū and the Resource Management (RMA) Rōpū.

Recommendation

That the Tūpuna Maunga Authority:

- a. **confirm** replacement appointments to the Tūpuna Maunga Authority Film and Events Rōpū and the Resource Management Act Rōpū.

Background

2. The Tūpuna Maunga Authority has established two Rōpū or sub-committees:
 - a. the Filming and Events Sub-committee, and
 - b. the Resource Management Act (RMA) Rōpū.
3. With this new term of the Authority and some new membership to the Authority, there is a need for new members to these rōpū.

Statutory Context

4. All decisions of the Authority must take into account the legislative and policy framework.
5. Section 109(2) of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014 requires the Authority to have regard to the spiritual, ancestral, cultural, customary, and historical significance of the Maunga to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau and that the Tūpuna Maunga is held in trust for Ngā Mana Whenua and the other people of Auckland.
6. The Tūpuna Maunga Authority's Integrated Management Plan was unanimously adopted (Mana Whenua and Auckland Council members) by the Authority pursuant to the Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014 and Reserves Act 1977. The Integrated Management Plan describes a series of "Values" and "Pathways" that guide all activities on the Tūpuna Maunga.
7. The Tūpuna Maunga Authority (Mana Whenua and Auckland Council members) unanimously adopted the Tūpuna Maunga Strategies at Hui 50 on 25 September 2020. The Tūpuna Maunga Strategies are 7 key sections that outline the strategic direction with regards to education, Biodiversity, Tūpuna Maunga design, Recreation, commercial activities and monitoring. Together with the IMP, these strategies inform guide and manage the activities undertaken on the Maunga.

8. The Authority administers the Tūpuna Maunga under the Reserves Act 1977 and pursuant to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014. The Hauraki Gulf Marine Park Act 2000 is also applicable in relation to Maungauika.

Discussion

The Filming and Events Rōpū

9. The role of the Filming and Events rōpū is to make decisions on event, filming, drone use in the delegation for filming and events on the Tūpuna Maunga that was adopted at Hui 3 (3 November 2014).
10. The Filming and Events Rōpu will generally refer major events to the Tūpuna Maunga Authority.
11. The Tūpuna Maunga Manager has the delegation to approve minor events such as picnics and small gatherings.
12. A delegation was also given to the filming and events rōpu to consider drone use applications at Hui 39 (27 August 2018).
13. The rōpū is comprised of four members of the Tūpuna Maunga Authority. The Chairperson, The Deputy Chairperson, 1 iwi member and 1 Auckland Council appointed member.

The RMA Rōpū

14. The RMA Rōpū is responsible for decision making for the Tūpuna Maunga Authority on relevant Resource Management Act (RMA) matters (such as resource consent applications and plan changes that affect the Tūpuna Maunga).
15. It has the delegation to participate in RMA matters as per the approved terms of reference and thresholds, adopted at Hui 32 (15 December 2017).
16. The RMA Rōpū is comprised of four members of the Tupuna Maunga Authority. The Chairperson, The Deputy Chairperson, 1 iwi member and 1 Auckland Council appointed member.

1. Key highlights in this quarter:

Planting season

The team continued the planting program within this quarter over ngā Tūpuna Maunga. Planting occurred across multiple Maunga with volunteer/community/organisation planting days carried out at Ōhinerau, Te Tātua a Riukiuta and Matukutūruru. Approximately 28,808 plants were planted over the May-Sept 2025 planting season.

Ruru Monitoring

Ruru monitoring was carried out across some of the Tūpuna Maunga to provide guidance on where ruru nest boxes would be installed. This monitoring was carried out across Maungawhau, Te Tātua a Riukiuta and Pukewīwī. Ruru nest boxes were installed during this quarter at Maungakiekie, Maungawhau, Te Tātua a Riukiuta, Takarunga and Pukewīwī.

Kī o Rahi Senior Regionals tournament held on Ōtāhuhu

The team partnered with College Sport Auckland and Kī o Rahi Tāmaki Makaurau to hold the senior regional tournament. A total of 22 teams participated and 300 rangatahi attended the day.
